In business, success comes down to meeting customers' needs. That's something SITE Staffing has effectively done for 21 years as it helps businesses find the workers they need.

"Our business exists to help people. If we put the right person into the right position, everything that happens after should be good," SITE Staffing owner Jeff Wein. "Our employee is happy, our customer is happy and we have a match."

Based at South Eighth Street and West National Avenue near the United Community Center on Milwaukee's south side, SITE Staffing employs an open door policy that encourages applicants to apply for placement in either temporary or temp-to-permanent jobs, Wein said.

"We work very hard to provide opportunities to the hard-working people of this community, and we will continue to do so for many years to come," said Wein, who joined SITE in 1999 and purchased the business in 2007.

SITE employs 36 and has branch offices in West Allis, Franklin, Brown Deer and Menomonee Falls.

The staffing agency helps companies fill professional, administrative, technical and industrial job openings. For the past 13 years, PAK Technologies, a Milwaukee-based blending, packaging and distribution company, has turned to SITE to find workers for its plant operations. Sharon Herbes, director of business administration and human resources, praised the relationship and how SITE employees "know our operation and know what kind of people we're looking for. It's been a strong relationship."

SITE employee focused on filling professional positions, started working with PAK. In just a short period of time, Herbes said his efforts have made a big difference.

"They are now our go-to source for direct-hire solutions in our office. We're very happy we can work with SITE on both finding workers for our plant and office," she said. "They are great to work with and understand their clients' needs."

Area employers are hurting for workers right now and Wein said SITE does what it can to prepare its applicants for the available jobs.

"We are in the middle of a low-supply, high-demand period for qualified workers," he said.

In addition to helping applicants brush
